

Steven Nadel

Steve Nadel is the Executive Director of the American Council for an Energy-Efficient Economy (ACEEE), a non-profit research organization that works on programs and policies to advance energy-efficient technologies and services. Steve has been at ACEEE for nearly 20 years serving as Deputy Director of the organization and Director of ACEEE's Utilities and Buildings programs prior to his promotion to Executive Director in 2001. Prior to ACEEE he planned and evaluated energy efficiency programs for New England Electric, a major electric utility; directed energy programs for the Massachusetts Audubon Society, Massachusetts' largest environmental organization; and ran energy programs for the a community organization working on housing rehabilitation in the poorest neighborhoods of New Haven, CT. Steve has worked in the energy efficiency field for nearly 30 years and has over 100 publications on energy-efficiency subjects. His current research interests include equipment efficiency standards, utility-sector energy efficiency programs and policies, and state and federal energy and climate change policy. He has a M.S. in Energy Management from the New York Institute of Technology, and a M.A. in Environmental Studies and B.A. in Government from Wesleyan University in Connecticut.
