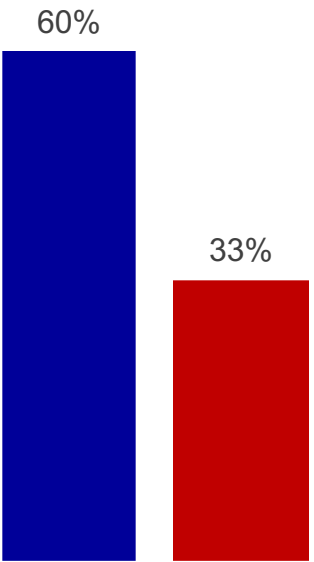
*Key findings from a survey among 800 likely voters,

At a broad level, majorities see the value of government during this period.

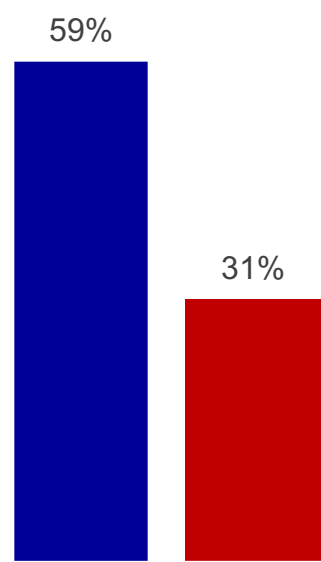
Role of Government

■ Gov't is doing too many things better left to business/individuals.

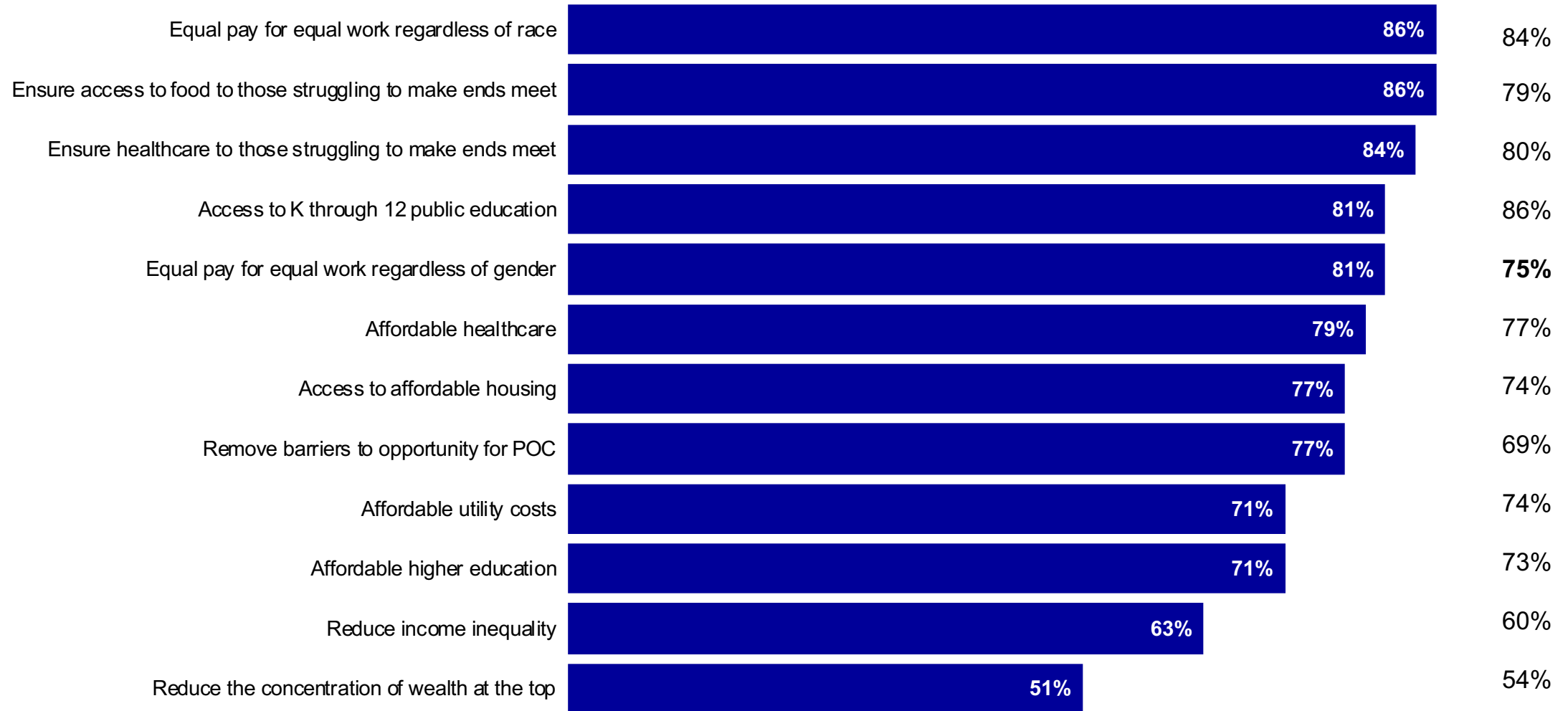

Proportions Saying Government Should Have MAJOR/SOME ROLE in Dealing with Each

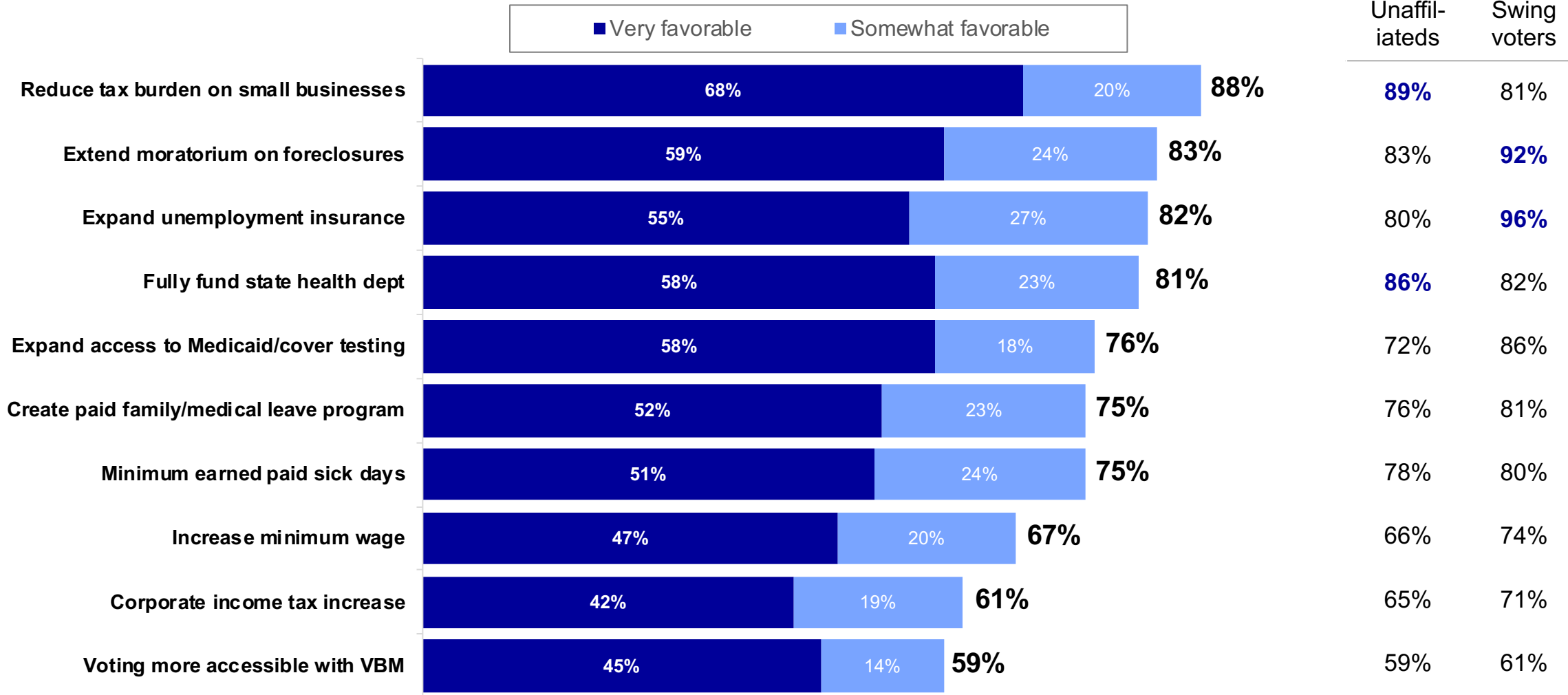
