A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 17A of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 control of HIV, so as to provide for certain information in publicly funded health facilities
- 3 offering HIV testing; to provide for definitions; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide
- 4 for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 **SECTION 1.**

- 7 Chapter 17A of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to control of
- 8 HIV, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 9 "31-17A-4.

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- 10 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'health care facility' means any hospital, health
- 11 clinic, community health center, health center operated by a county board of health or the
- 12 Department of Public Health, or a similar medical facility that receives any state or local
- 13 funds.

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- 14 (b) Any health care provider in a health care facility that offers an HIV test to an
- 15 individual shall ensure that the patient receives timely information and counseling, as
- 16 appropriate, to explain the results and the implications for the patient's health. If a patient
- 17 tests positive for HIV infection, the health care provider shall inform the patient that there
- are numerous treatment options available, including ongoing clinical trials, and identify 18
- 19 follow-up testing and care that may be recommended, including contact information for
- 20 medical and psychological services. If a patient tests negative for HIV infection, the health
- 21 care provider shall advise the patient of the need for periodic testing or retesting; shall
- verification of results; shall provide information about methods that prevent or reduce the 23

- risk of contracting HIV, including, but not limited to, preexposure prophylaxis and 24
- postexposure prophylaxis, consistent with guidance from the federal Centers for Disease
- 26 Control and Prevention; and may offer prevention counseling or a referral to prevention

- writing, orally, or both.
- 29 (c) This Code section shall stand repealed on June 30, 2020."

30 **SECTION 2.**

31 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
